Story: Muhammad's Garden

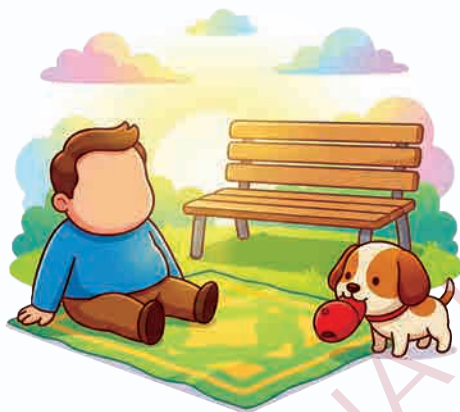
